

If they still won't listen, tell the church.

If they won't listen to the church, you'll have to start over from scratch, confront them with the need for repentance, and offer again God's forgiving love.

Take this most seriously:

A yes on earth is yes in heaven; a no on earth is no in heaven.


What you say to one another is eternal. I mean this.

The rebuilding process has begun across Maui following the devastating wildfires that killed at least 115 people and displaced thousands more. Overall, the wildfire has affected an estimated 3,453 acres of land.
