From the Pastor

Mark 2:23-28

One Sabbath Jesus was going through the grainfields, and as his disciples walked along, they began to pick some heads of grain. The Pharisees said to him, "Look, why are they doing what is unlawful on the Sabbath?" He answered, "Have you never read what David did when he and his companions were hungry and in need? In the days of Abiathar the high priest, he entered the house of God and ate the consecrated bread, which is lawful only for priests to eat. And he also gave some to his companions." Then he said to them, "The Sabbath was made for people, not people for the Sabbath. So the Son of Man is Lord even of the Sabbath."

Sabbatical Report

This was not intended to be what I think of as a 'working sabbatical' where someone takes time off, but the time off is really just time to work on other things apart from what they do during a usual weekday: write a book, take classes, etc. The purpose was to have some adventures and connect with my family, especially given how rarely I am able to do so with a spread-out family and limited travel budget. I am happy to say that it was a success, though we had to remain adaptable, in all the ways I'd hoped.

The sabbatical began with a lot of work and cleaning around the house, as well as the start of a task I'd been putting off - clearing out the storage space we've kept for the last 9 years. With some moving and consolidating that I've been able to do over the last year, finally going through everything would help a friend of ours as well as us. In the midst of this work, and some relaxation as well, I had time to travel to York for my friend's 51st birthday party, which was a wonderful break. I also had a lot of time to write, and tried sitting outside at our new outdoor table in the morning until the mosquitoes drove me back inside.

Poppy and I then traveled to Akron, OH and then to Cleveland to stay with my sister Liz and brother-in-law Dave. Normally I see them, at best, every three or four years, and this was part of the core purpose of the sabbatical - to reconnect with family. The time was wonderful. We got to see two zoos, an aquarium, and the Cleveland Art Museum (which is huge, beautiful, and free). My sister got a picture with Poppy in the armor room at the Art Museum, and she then posted it paired with a picture of her in the same room with a much-younger Poppy.






When we returned home, Pam tested positive for COVID, so we went into at-home COVID quarantine mode for that week. Not much got done because quarantining in half of a 1000 square foot townhouse is a

bit of a challenge. Fortunately we have two bathrooms and a couch that is relatively comfortable to sleep on. We succeeded, because we all tested negative by Friday, just in time for Poppy's birthday celebration on Saturday. She chose to go with a few friends to the Philadelphia Zoo, and that's what we did, braving the heat in the mid-90s and getting treats on the way home after a long day.

Not long after we got back, Pam joined us and we drove to Mystic, CT and then on to Maine. In Mystic Pam finally got to visit the Seaport and we learned a lot about the history of whaling (much to Poppy's chagrin). In Maine we stayed with my uncle. Poppy and I had a three-hour sailing lesson, and we explored the area around Camden, including going to the top of Mount Baddie and strolling around Camden harbor. We were also able to be there for a memorial dinner for my aunt Marie who died earlier this summer. My mother was also in Maine at the time, as we were able to pull together enough money from my siblings, uncle and me to pay for something from her long-term bucket list - a week at Pemaguid Point.

This meant she could also see us, share a couple of meals, and be there for the memorial dinner as well. On the way back we stopped in Mystic again, this time to meet some beluga whales, see a sea lion performance, and otherwise enjoy Mystic Aquarium (much to Poppy's enjoyment).

We came home a full day before school would start for Poppy so that she could have a day off and do all she felt like she needed to be ready for 6th grade, and for the remainder of August I finished cleaning out the storage space and made two appointments for blood tests I'd been putting off for longer than I care to admit (I hate having blood drawn). My fasting glucose is down, and my A1c was basically flat since last time, so my doctor is happy but I am going to continue working on it.



Finance Committee – Financial Results

The Finance Committee again thanks members and friends for your continued support of the church.

Year to Date Income

- Pledged giving is under budget by \$ 13,500 A shortfall of 10%
- Unpledged giving is under budget by \$4,050 A shortfall of 28%
- Dividends and interest from our investments and the Givebutter parking app income have performed better than expected
- For the year, church income is on budget

Year to Date Expenses

• Church committees have done good work in keeping expenses to the budget. Expenses year to date are under budget by \$ 2,350

Year to date Profit and Loss

• Through August, our net loss, actual income to expense is \$ 56,200. That is slightly better than the budget.


As reported previously, our budgeted net loss for the year is \$80,877

Sunday School

Our regular Sunday School year began on September 17. We had an amazing turnout for the first day! The children had the opportunity to get reacquainted and preview some of the things we'll be working on in Sunday School this year.

A **Family Bingo Night** is scheduled for Friday, October 13. You should have received an email notice and sign up link. Details will also be posted in the Sunday bulletin and in the BEAT.

Confirmation Class, for young disciples from Grade 6 and up, has begun monthly meetings, the first having been held on September 24. Classes will meet after worship for two-hour sessions that will include lunch. On those days when Confirmation Class is held, members of the class will attend and participate in the worship service rather than Sunday School.



On September 5, a small group of children and parents visited the West Chester office of Chrissy Houlahan, representative of the 6th Congressional district.

Representative Houlahan met with us, received our Offering of Letters, and spoke about her efforts in Congress on behalf of poor and hungry individuals and families.



This is what being a volunteer with us means...

Training: Part 1 is a 4 hour self-guided, self-paced on-line training. Part 2 is 2 hours in-person. Criminal Background Checks and Child Abuse Clearances are needed to be obtained. This whole onboarding time takes about 1 month. **Meeting the family**: Bridge of Hope staff will facilitate a gathering with the group and family, typically 2 hours at a local park or someone's home.

12-18 months of working together as a group to walk alongside a family coming out of housing instability:

Some of you may have housing connections to share, some of you may have a garage full of nice furniture waiting for a new home, some of you may have trucks to help move that furniture. Some of you may have free time to talk on the phone with a single mom after a hard day at work, or send a note encouraging her as she prepares for a job interview. The time you put in is your choice and since we will be a group of 6-10 people hopefully the work can be shared. A Bridge of Hope case manager is part of the team to help facilitate relationships and guide the goal setting and bring you into supporting goals being met by the family.

3 month review: One hour zoom meeting at the 3 month mark with you to debrief how things are going.

4 Neighborhood Gatherings throughout the year. These are Bridge of Hope hosted events for your group to come together to have fun (Christmas party, ice cream social) and learn (dinner and guest speaker). We try to space these out across the county so one group isn't driving very far for each gathering.

Graduation: At the end of the family's journey with Bridge of Hope we have a celebration together. This looks like whatever the family wants to do (a lunch out together, gathering at someone's home for cake, etc).

Wrap up meeting: Brief meeting with volunteer group about how things went
