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From the Pastor

Today someone brought in some historical items from a member who passed away (it isn't a secret who, but I felt odd putting names in the Perspective without asking first). One of the items was the Order of Service for the Installation as Pastor of The Reverend Douglas Dunderdale, from Sunday evening April 20, 1958. As with a pastor's installation now, there are questions that our constitution, the Book of Order, requires us to ask of one another. Here are the questions from that night in 1958:

The Constitutional Questions to the Pastor-Elect

Are you now willing to take the charge of this congregation, as their Pastor, agreeably to your declaration upon accepting their call?

Do you consciously believe and declare, as far as you know your own heart, that in taking upon you this charge, you are influenced by a sincere desire to promote the glory of God, and the good of His Church?

Do you solemnly promise that, by the assistance of the grace of God, you will endeavor faithful to discharge all duties of a Pastor to this congregation; and will be careful to maintain a deportment in all respects becoming a minister of the Gospel of Christ, agreeably to your ordination engagements?

The Constitutional Questions of the People

Do you, the people of this congregation, continue to profess your readiness to receive the Reverend Douglas A. Dunderdale, whom you have called to be your Pastor?

Do you promise to receive the word of truth from his mouth, with meekness and love; and to submit to him in the due exercise of discipline?

Do you promise to encourage him in his arduous labor, and to assist his endeavors for your instruction and spiritual edification?

Do you engage to continue with him, while he is your Pastor, that competent and worldly maintenance which you have promised, and whatever else you may see needful for the honor of religion, and his comfort among you?

For any of you who have been there for a more recent installation, you can see that some things have changed significantly over time. Rev. Dunderdale was pastor here from 1958 to 1968. For context, 1968 was the all-time peak of church attendance in American history (at least as long as the numbers have been recorded). It was also a time when the role of a Pastor was seen quite differently.

One difference is the idea that the congregation was to 'receive the word of truth from his mouth, with meekness and love', and to submit to the Pastor in the exercise of discipline. This particular question got a surprised laugh from the people in the office with me as we read through them, and I think that was in part because it represents a very hierarchical view of the role of Pastor.

Similarly, in the third question that follows, it frames the role of Pastor as the one who endeavors to instruct and spiritually edify, and the congregation as the one who encourages him. In contrast, I was taught in Seminary, and by my intern supervisor and so on, that it is the Pastor who supports the ministry of the congregation, not the other way around. It makes much more sense for one trained person to support the work of a hundred people living Christian lives than for a hundred people to support the work of one, at least in my view. (And I know this is an oversimplification, but it is a real difference in viewpoint)

For this Pastoral Perspective, I suppose I just wanted to reflect on my own perspective in contrast to the perspective in 1958, at least how it was reflected in the installation service of one pastor in one congregation at the time. And I don't mean to disparage the viewpoint at the time. I think it's important to remember that church changes, sometimes dramatically over the years. It changes because of the movement of the Spirit, and because we learn new things or get better information, and because our society changes in that it needs and what it expects. In 1958 I think that being a Protestant Pastor was a relatively respected, high-status position of influence. In 2024 it's more common for people to not have any idea, or have quite wrong ideas, of what a Pastor is and does, and in terms of status it is definitely a mixed review in my experience. Fortunately for me (and maybe obviously) I find the promises I made when I was installed more approachable and descriptive of what I try to do each week:

*Do you trust in the Lord Jesus Christ your Savior, acknowledge him Lord of all and Head of the Church,
and through him believe in one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?*

Do you accept the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be, by the Holy Spirit, the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ in the Church universal, and God's Word to you?

Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those confessions as you lead the people of God?

Will you fulfill your ministry in obedience to Jesus Christ, under the authority of Scripture, and be continually guided by our confessions?

Will you be governed by our church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit?

Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world?

Do you promise to further the peace, unity, and purity of the church?

Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love?

Will you be a faithful teaching elder, proclaiming the good news in Word and Sacrament, teaching faith and caring for people? Will you be active in government and discipline, serving in the councils of the church;

and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

As you can see, some things change, and others have not. There are definitely more questions now than there were in 1958, and there is less of a presumption of what I believe - the first three questions are basically checking to make sure I accept the basic tenets of my profession. I'm responsible to be active in government and discipline, as part of the councils of the church rather than over this particular congregation - when needed, that is the Session's responsibility, and I'm under their discipline as much as anyone else.

These nine questions (the ninth even has three parts to it) represent a time when less is taken for granted, perhaps, because we have a better understanding of the diversity in what it means to be Presbyterian. So we have to spell out some things that might have been assumed in the past. There is also more detail in my responsibilities - follow the Lord, love neighbors, work for the reconciliation of the world; further the peace, unity, and purity of the church; pray for and serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love? And so on.

Looking back at the questions asked of Dunderdale, perhaps I can see why they used the word "arduous." These questions seem less efficient, and cover more ground, and also cover some different ground.

Here are the questions that the congregation answered in 2018, when I was installed as long-term Pastor at FPC. Some of you reading this were there, and some of you have joined since then:

Do we, the members of the church, accept Doug as our pastor chosen by God through the voice of this congregation to guide us in the way of Jesus Christ?

Do we agree to pray for him, encourage him, to respect his decisions, and to follow as he guides us, serving Jesus Christ who alone is Head of the Church?

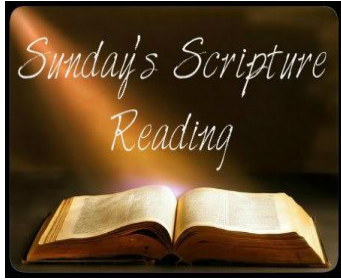
Do we promise to pay him fairly and provide for his welfare as he works among us; to stand by him in trouble and share his joys?

Will we listen to the word he preaches, welcome his pastoral care, and honor his authority as he seeks to honor and obey Jesus Christ our Lord?

There is a lot here to reflect on, and I realize that this was too big a topic to cover in a single Perspective. I might take it up again in the future. In the meantime, one thing I appreciate about the current version of questions asked at installation is that they remind us, more than once, that Christ is head of the church, and that we are all together doing our best to follow him. In the midst of that journey, we build a community together where we care for one another and support one another. Hopefully it is a community of mutual respect and accountability where the Pastor is a professional with certain skills, but where we are all responsible for living Christian lives together.

I'm curious about any of your thoughts on the differences between installation in 1958 and in 2018. I know some of you were there - do you see more difference, or more continuity, just with different words? If you could write your own questions to ask a pastor, or questions you'd like to be asked as a member of the congregation, what would those be?

St. Mary's is hiring! St Mary's Franciscan Shelter for homeless families is seeking a live-in house manager to oversee the shelter's operation Monday – Friday from 9:30 PM – 9:00 AM. Holiday and additional hours might also be available.

The overnight house manager can sleep after closing/securing the shelter (11 PM – 6 AM). This shift is considered “on call” should there be an issue overnight. The House Manager is to be available by 6:30 to set up breakfast, oversee the needs of residents, perform light housekeeping, and answer phones until 9 AM.

Job responsibilities include: Closing shelter, setting up breakfast, overseeing the needs of residents, light housekeeping, and answering phones

Compensation includes room, food, laundry facilities, all utilities (including internet and cable) and a bi-weekly stipend of \$500.

Betsey & Eric Moe

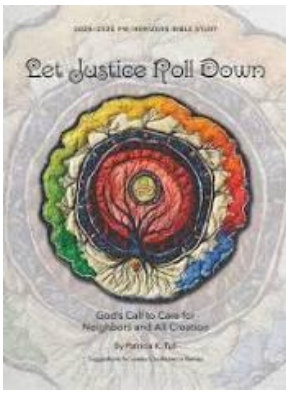
Here is an excerpt from a recent letter from Betsey & Eric Moe on March 7th. You can read the full letter in our Missionaries folder.

Finance Committee 2024 First Quarter Financial Results Comparative Results 2024 to 2023

Income

- Pledge receipts were below planned giving by \$22,500. 45% under plan.
 - In 2023, pledge receipts were below planned giving by \$ 26,000. 41% under plan.
- Unpledged giving was above planned giving by \$ 4,200
 - In 2023 Unpledged giving was below planned giving by \$915
- Givebutter parking lot income was below planned giving by \$ 490
 - In 2023 Givebutter parking lot income exceeded planned giving by \$ 1,300
- In 2023 and 2024, Dividends and interest income exceeded planned giving

Expenses

- Expenses were over budget by \$ 1,770
 - In 2023 Overall budgeted expenses were favorable and under budget by \$ 2,400

Net Income –Gain/Loss

- Net loss for the quarter was \$ 31,200. Budgeted loss was \$ 21,360
